Jeff Davis was appointed University Carillonist at the University of California, Berkeley in July of 2000. He began carillon studies in 1984 with Berkeley's first University Carillonist, Ronald Barnes. Prior to his tenure at Berkeley, Davis was University Carillonist at the University of the South in Sewanee, Tennessee.

Davis passed the advancement examination of The Guild of Carillonneurs in North America in 1988 and has served that organization in a variety of offices, currently serving on the juries of both the Johan Franco Composition committee and the Examination committee. Davis was a Director of the Guild from 1996 to 2001, and President from 1996 to 2000. In addition to service for the GCNA, Davis has also served as a member of the Committee of Delegates of the World Carillon Federation.

Davis has given recitals throughout the United States and Europe. He has been a guest artist in the Ann Arbor Festival, the Barcelona International Festival, and has twice represented the GCNA in recitals at congresses of the World Carillon Federation. He was awarded the Berkeley Medal for distinguished service to the carillon in 1993.

A composer as well as carillonist, Davis studied composition with Don Gillis, Deems Taylor, and Howard Hanson. He attended the National Music Camp at Interlochen, Michigan, and was made a Distinguished Alumnus of Interlochen in 1974. His works, in a wide variety of media, have not been performed nearly enough.
