In June 2008 at Berkeley, California, Carol Anne was accepted as a Carillonneur member of the Guild of Carillonneurs of North America by completing its advancement examination process, which culminated in a performance for a jury panel and members of the Guild. She also received the Ronald Barnes Memorial Scholarship to study carillon performance with William De Turk at the Bok Tower Gardens in Lakes Wales, Florida.
