Jim holds a Bachelor of Music Education from Benedictine University, Lisle, Illinois. He has served as a church organist since 1967, first at SS. Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Naperville and, since 1978, at Visitation Catholic Church in Elmhurst, Illinois. He is an Assistant Branch Manager with Wachovia Securities in Naperville, now a division of Wells Fargo & Company.
