

When and Where are classes held?

All classes are held at the Chicago Botanic Garden with limited site visits to outside venues. Core classes are programmed on weekday evenings and weekends to accommodate working professionals and adults with busy lifestyles.

How large are the classes?

Lecture classes can hold up to 50 students. Lab formats are limited to 20—24 students. Design courses are limited to 16 students.

How much will this cost?

Classes average \$13 per instructional hour

How long will this take me?

We offer students a flexible approach to their education allowing them to finish a program at their own pace. Some programs can be completed in as little as 2 years and others have up to 7 years for completion. Students may enroll in a single course to address a specific need or interest; build a sequence of courses to meet individual needs; or earn a certificate of completion for a specific program of study.

Where do I start?

Botany 1 is a prerequisite for most courses, but select classes may be taken prior to fulfilling this requirement.

All certificate students are asked to provide an email address for program and course updates, confirmation letters, supply lists and general student correspondence.

Through the Joseph Regenstein, Jr. School, the professional expertise, and talents of the Garden's horticulturists and educators are shared with students of all levels.

What is a certificate?

A Certificate signifies that a student has successfully fulfilled all the requirements of a prescribed series of courses. Certificates are awarded each year, and have been used by many individuals to prepare for entry-level positions in plant-related occupations or to obtain salary raises or increased responsibilities in their current positions.

CERTIFICATE OF MERIT PROGRAMS

Professional Gardener Level 1 & 2 Certificate of Merit Program (PGL 1 & 2)

In the Professional Gardener Program, students gain the fundamental knowledge and skills required of garden professionals. This training program features hands-on learning leading to a new career or career advancement in the green industry.

This certificate represents a competency based qualification relevant to the region's industry. Learn what it takes to meet and exceed standards of horticultural excellence.

There are no prerequisites for this Certificate Program and no prior horticulture experience is needed.

Who Should Participate

- Aspiring professional gardeners and landscape technicians
- Gardeners, landscape maintenance professionals and other green industry individuals seeking professional development

Program Requirements

After completing Botany 1, all remaining core courses may be taken in any order. If no other prerequisite is listed, the course may be taken at any time.

For the certificate, a grade of at least 70 percent must be achieved for each core course. All requirements for the certificate must be completed within five years of the start date of your first core course.

You can prove proficiency for up to 20 percent of the coursework by passing proficiency exams or providing transcripts indicating grades of at least 70 percent for similar courses. There is no separate enrollment for the program.

Students pursuing the PGL2 certificate are encouraged to complete their Ornamental Plant Materials certificate as well. This only requires the addition of 24 hours of elective credit.

**Class may be taken prior to fulfilling the Botany 1 requirement.*
