The Event

Join the Chicago Botanic Garden to experience **Lost & Found**, a story of hope and action in the conservation world. From June to September 2024, commissioned artworks developed in collaboration with Garden scientists will explore the themes of plants and habitats that are “lost” (extinct or endangered), and “found” through plant conservation success stories.

Through installations, sculptures, participatory theatrical performances, craft workshops, interactive storytelling, and more, the featured artists will explore the intersections among nature, science, and art to inspire visitors to join the urgent, global effort to conserve and care for our world. Visitors will explore the themes of culture, interconnectedness, growth, and stewardship—and discover how things that are lost can be found again.



The Setting

All summer long, playful, innovative installations, programs, and displays will delight visitors as they explore the Garden’s 385 acres—an extraordinary and unique backdrop—and engage with nature in new ways. The Garden, one of the world’s great living museums and conservation science centers, has more than two million plants in its collection. Summer is a peak time at the Garden, both for the number of visitors and for blooms in our display gardens.
