White Oak

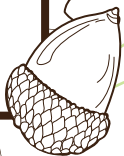
Bur Oak

= number of oak species here

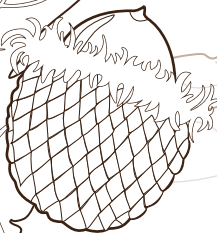
100+

We can't tell exactly how old the trees are without chopping them down and counting the rings. However, we are giving the oldest honor to a white oak (*Quercus alba*) in McDonald Woods near the Lake Cook Road entrance.
