Course: Botanical Watercolor: Exquisite Orchids

Required Materials:

- 1. Paper
 - Watercolor Paper: various choices, good quality recommended.
 - One or two sheets (11"x15 or larger) of hot pressed watercolor paper, 140Lb (2ply) or 300Lb (3ply) recommended
 - One extra sheet of paper for practice and color note.
 - One or two sheets of layout/tracing paper
- 2. Brushes Round sable brushes with good tips are recommended.
 - Winsor & Newton Series 7 Miniature Kolinsky Sable watercolor brushes (#4 and #1 or 0)

• Winsor & Newton Series 7 Kolinsky Sable Pointed Round #3 (This is not miniature, but regular)

- One or two cheap, medium size synthetic brush for mixing
- Two synthetic brushes for lift-out; Da Vinci Cosmo top spin, flat, #2 and #8 http://www.dickblick.com/products/da-vinci-cosmotop-spin-flat/

 - 3. Watercolor Paints:
 - Any brand is fine, artist or professional quality. Try small tubes as a starter if available.
 - The specimen will be pink/purple orchid.
 - Recommended paints: Permanent Rose (Winsor & Newton), Quinacridone pink (Daniel Smith), Quinacridone magenta (DS)- or permanent magenta (W&N), Brilliant Pink (Holbein),
 - French Ultra Marine (W&N), Winsor Blue Green Shade (W&N), Winsor Yellow (W&N)- or Pure Yellow (Schmincke), Raw Sienna (W/N), Burnt Sienna (W/N)
 - (Similar colors can be used)

4. Palette

- At least two generous size "flat" plates- important for planning the whole painting process.
- 5. Other miscellaneous materials
 - Drawing board: light weight foam board is good.

• Magnifying lens, 2 water jars, paper towel, ruler, specimen container, small spray. Helping hand or other similar equipment to hold specimens and keep them fresh.
